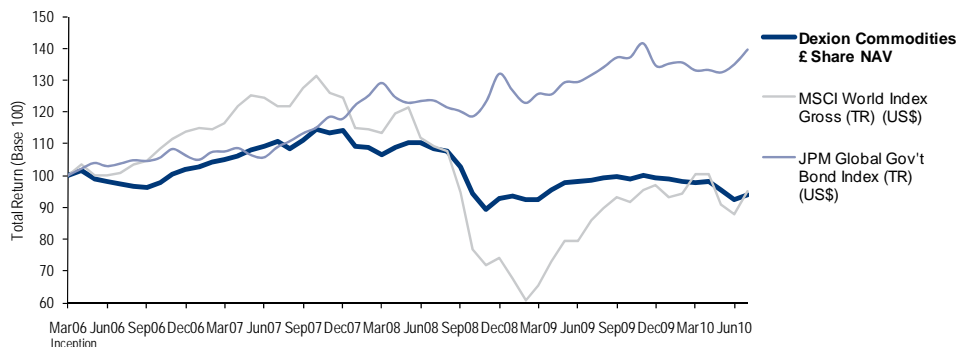


Investment Adviser Portfolio Outlook

The combination of macro and micro factors provided an excellent trading environment for commodity hedge funds in July, thereby allowing the Portfolio to generate positive returns. The strongest returns were driven by base metals, grains and long equity positions. Improved investor sentiment and deteriorating supply fundamentals in markets such as copper and wheat also drove prices higher. Despite the strong returns, managers continue to trade cautiously given the tendency for commodities to correlate highly with risky assets, as they have done year to date. An active trading energy strategy was added to the portfolio on August 1, and the aim is to invest in additional dynamic strategies in energy and metals in the months ahead.

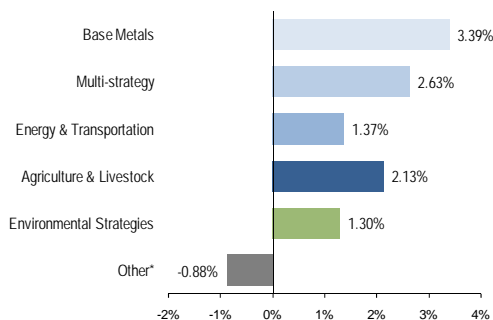

Sector Overview

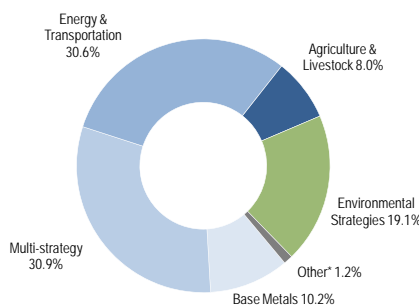
Monthly Sector Performance (as at 30 July 2010)⁵

Overview

Dexion Commodities Limited is a Guernsey registered, closed-ended investment company listed on the London Stock Exchange. The investment objective is to maximise medium-term returns in a manner commensurate with acceptable risk management. The Company seeks to achieve its investment objective through investment in an actively managed portfolio focusing upon commodities and environmental strategies accessed, directly or indirectly, through a multi-manager, multi-strategy portfolio of commodities themed hedge funds. The Company's shares are denominated in Sterling, Euros and US Dollars and the Company generally implements a hedging policy to protect the Sterling and Euro value of its US Dollar denominated investments.

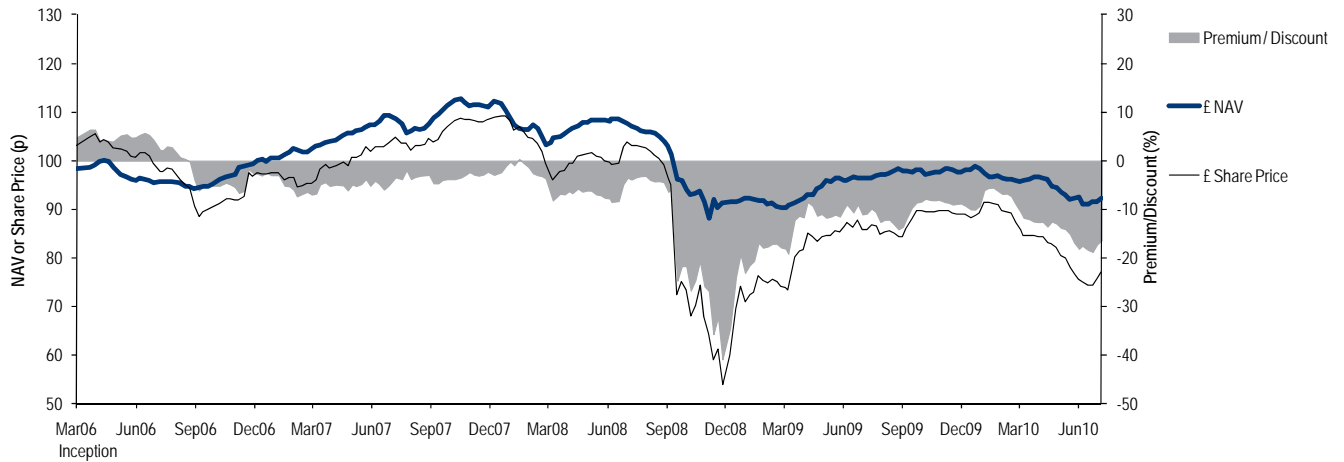
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Share Price Performance^{1,7}

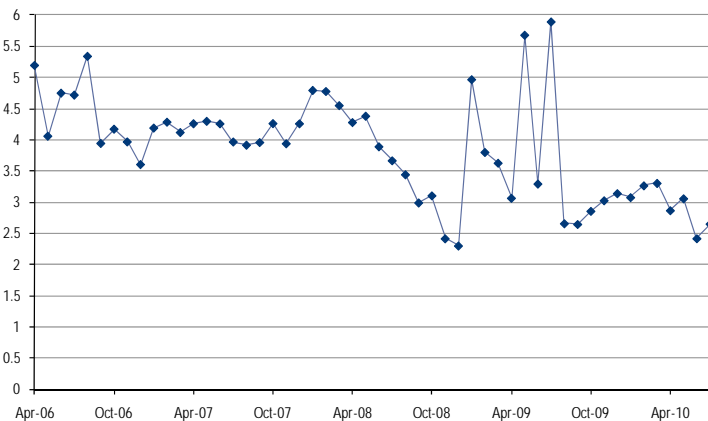

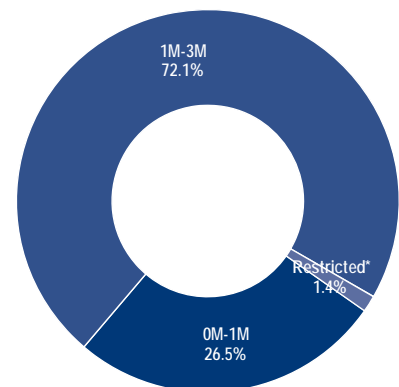

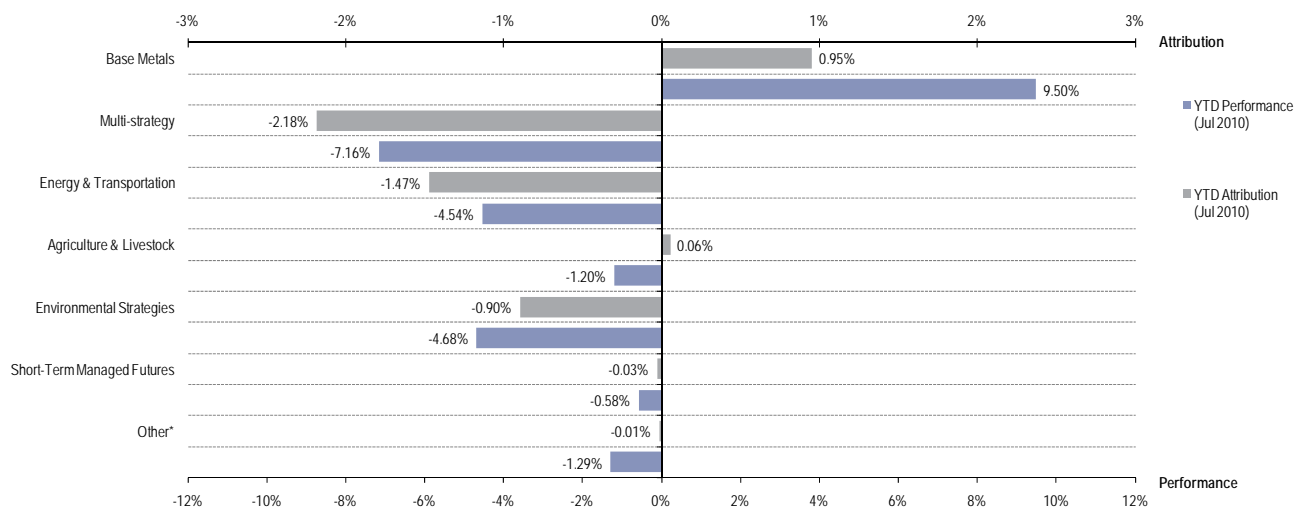
Portfolio Liquidity¹⁰ as at 30 July 2010

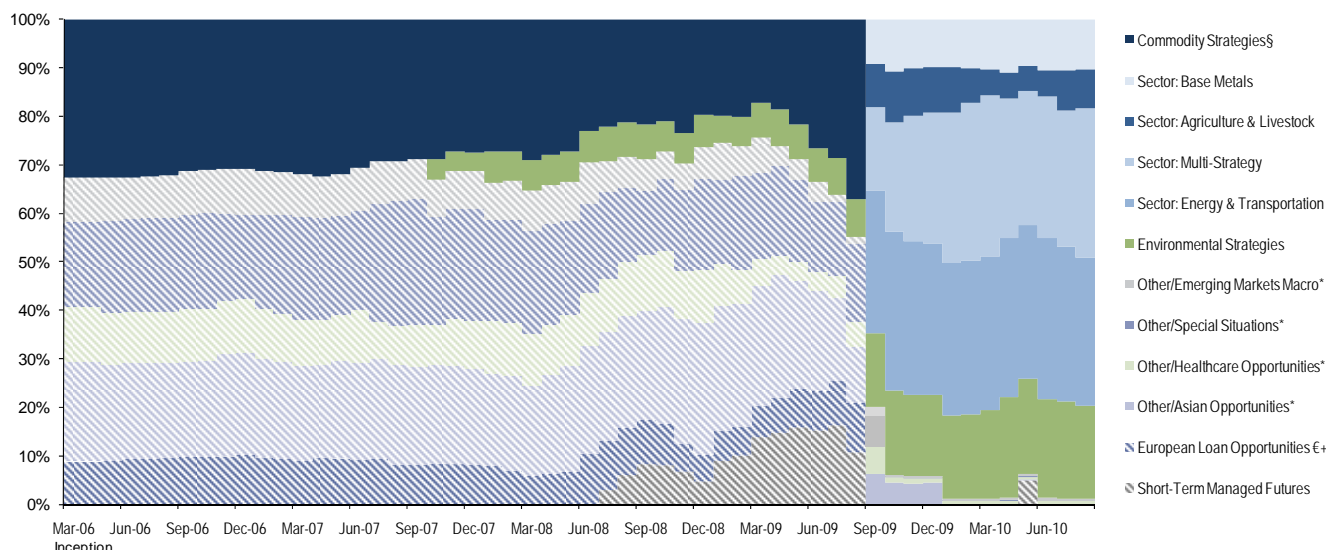
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Strategy Performance and Attribution¹¹

Commodity Strategies				Risk appetite increased in July following a positive reaction to the European bank 'stress test' results and a number of better-than-expected Q2 earnings results. Investors also took comfort from some solid data releases in Europe which reduced fears over the Eurozone economic fragility. However, downbeat data in the US, including worse-than-expected Q2 GDP figures, combined with a reduced outlook for domestic growth, led to increasing concerns over growth prospects in the US.
Base Metals	3.39%	10.2%	2	The renewed appetite for risk led raw materials higher in July as a weaker US Dollar spurred cash flow back into commodity markets. Notable gains derived from one manager who secured profits across their portfolio but was highly concentrated in the allocation to base metals, where the majority of risk was held. Long copper positions proved particularly profitable as this metal rallied on the back of a Q2 report on the mining sector, which indicated a decline in output as a result of lower ore grades. Further gains were generated by long and spread positions in tin and zinc. Exposure to agricultural commodities also benefited manager returns over the month. Wheat prices surged by more than 40% while corn generated double-digit gains as droughts in Russia, the world's third largest wheat exporter, combined with heavy rain in Canada, raised the prospect of supply constraints. For one manager, the early identification of drought conditions in the Black Sea region helped secure strong gains as they increased their allocation to wheat and corn in early July. Equity focused managers generated strong gains as commodity equities rallied in tandem with the wider market. One manager was able to profit on both the long and short sides in metals markets as trades in a number of mining names proved beneficial. Another manager also profited from positions in the oil services sector as oil-focused equities increased after inventories fell in the aftermath of Hurricane Alex.

Environmental Strategies	1.30%	19.1%	7	Amid the generally upbeat market conditions, environmental themes prospered, with the Wilderhill Clean Energy Index rising by over 10% as investors' appetite for alternative energy sources improved. Unsurprisingly, long positions drove performance, with short books generally detracting from performance. One manager secured solid gains from their exposure to agricultural/bio-fuels, with additional gains deriving from holdings in energy infrastructure and water stocks. One US-based manager had a particularly profitable month as several of their core long positions in solar and clean technology stocks rallied strongly. One of the manager's key holdings in a manufacturer of critical backup power systems and continuous power solutions rose over 40% on the back of positive earnings results and news of a substantial increase in customer orders.

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Dexion Commodities Limited (formerly Dexion Alpha Strategies Limited) ("DCL" or "the Company")

On 31 July 2009, the Company announced through RNS that the reorganisation proposals that it had put forward to shareholders had been unanimously passed at the Extraordinary General Meeting held earlier the same day. As a result, the Company's investment policy was refocused as a multi-manager, multi-strategy portfolio of commodities themed hedge funds, managed on a day to day basis by Man Investments (CH) AG – Guernsey branch (formerly RMF Investment Management – Nassau branch). To better reflect the Company's revised investment policy, the Company's name has been changed to Dexion Commodities Limited. As at 1 February 2010, approximately 99% (excluding cash) of the portfolio was in commodity and environmental investments, in line with expectations.

It should be noted that derivative trades do not require 100% cash financing, and the typical margin to equity ratio is 15-20%, thus the cash borrowing requirement for these strategies is very limited relative to the gross exposures.
- 10 As at 30 July 2010 the percentage of the Portfolio (excluding cash) that can be redeemed within various time periods based on all the managers in the Portfolio. This analysis does include notice periods, however it does not include settlement periods. There is no look-through to the liquidity of the underlying hedge funds invested by the Man Commodity Strategies fund (formerly RMF Commodity Strategies fund) and the Man Environmental Opportunities fund (formerly RMF Environmental Opportunities fund). Cash proceeds from redemptions are received after the redemption date and this period will vary between hedge funds. Typically, hedge funds distribute 90% of a redemption amount within 30 days of the redemption date, with the remainder of the full balance of the redemption amount distributed up to 60 days after the completion of that hedge funds' audit, which can be several months after the redemption date, typically without the payment of any interest. This analysis does not account for lock-ups, under which the ability to redeem is restricted for a period, typically one or two years. While most of the investments in the Portfolio have "burned off" their lock-ups, certain investments may still be subject to a lock-up. In certain cases, there may be an ability to redeem prior to the expiration of a lock-up period through the payment of an early redemption fee, generally ranging from 2-5%. DCL's liquidity is subject to change and the information in this chart is not an indication of the Portfolio's future liquidity. The Portfolio's liquidity will change as it allocates and reallocates capital among the underlying hedge funds. In addition, underlying hedge funds often have the ability to suspend redemptions, restrict redemptions to a specified percentage of the underlying hedge fund's net assets (e.g. a "gate") and/or restrict investors from redeeming their interest in certain investments (e.g. "side pockets"), all of which would reduce the liquidity of DCL. In particular, the likelihood that a hedge fund may suspend redemptions, invoke a gate or side pocket certain investments is likely to increase during times of market stress that cause investors to redeem from hedge funds.
